Free Summer Camps for Teens and Young Adults with Disabilities

CARSON CITY, NV – The Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR) Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) is offering free pre-employment camps to help youth with disabilities successfully transition from high school to post-secondary education and/or employment.

The 16 summer camps are designed for students with disabilities ages 14 to 21. Camps will last one week and take place Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. June through August. This summer, camps will happen in Carson City, Elko, Ely, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Pahrump, Reno, and Yerington.

Pre-employment camps provide an interactive environment where students can explore new career paths, learn about educational opportunities, and develop a variety of essential skills to prepare them for employment. In addition to general pre-employment daytime and overnight camps, VR often offers specialty camps for youth who are deaf and hard of hearing, have autism or who are blind or visually impaired.

In collaboration with approved providers, VR customizes each camp to focus on five key Pre-Employment Services: Job Exploration, Post-Secondary Education Counseling, Workplace Readiness Training, Self-Advocacy, and Work Based Learning Experiences.
