### **DETR Releases Local Area Employment Statistics for March 2026**

According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation's ([DETR](#)) March 2026 economic report, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in March 2026 which was unchanged from February. Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen economic patterns, with the following estimates not seasonally adjusted.

In the three Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA), the unemployment rates were 5.4 percent in the Las Vegas area, 4.3 percent in Reno, and 4.2 percent in the Carson area in March 2026.

In Nevada's counties, the lowest unemployment rate was observed in Humboldt County at 3.5 percent, and Mineral County had the highest rate at 9.2 percent. For a look at the unemployment rate in your county, visit our [Area Profiles Page](#).

# Counties and Cities Employment & Unemployment

**March 2026**

Published on May 5, 2026

In March 2026, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada remained steady at 5.3 percent compared to February 2026. Over the same period, the unadjusted unemployment rate decreased by 0.4 pp, from 5.5 percent to 5.1 percent. The seasonally adjusted number of employed individuals in the state went up by 2,729, compared to February 2026.

At the MSA (Metropolitan Statistical Area) level, unemployment rates decreased across all Nevada MSAs compared to February 2026. In the Las Vegas-Henderson-North Las Vegas MSA, the unemployment rate decreased by 0.4 pp, moving from 5.8 percent in February to 5.4 percent. The Reno-Sparks MSA unemployment rate decreased by 0.3 pp, changing from 4.6 percent to 4.3 percent. Meanwhile, the Carson City MSA unemployment rate decreased by 0.3 pp, moving from 4.5 percent in February to 4.2 percent. These figures are not seasonally adjusted.

At the county level, a majority of Nevada's counties (16 out of 17) experienced a decrease in unemployment rates compared to February 2026. The counties with the largest decreases were Esmeralda (-1.9 pp), followed by Mineral (-1.1 pp).

Figures for state unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program, a state/federal partnership sponsored by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS-LAUS). This program produces monthly and annual employment, unemployment, and labor force data for census regions, states, counties, metropolitan areas, and many large cities, based on place of residence. 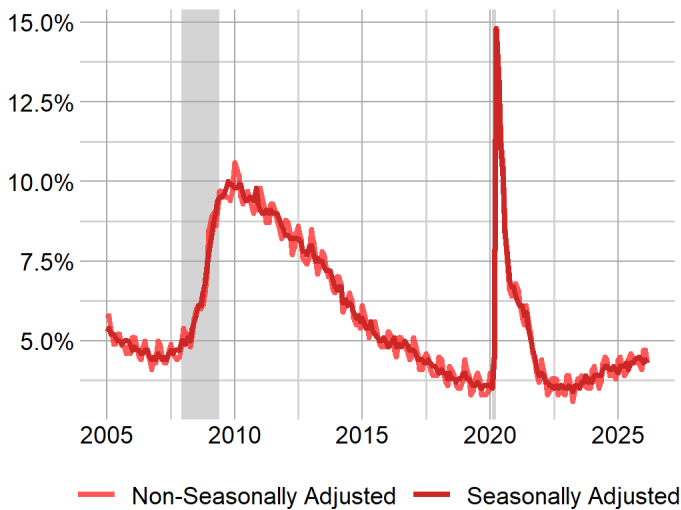

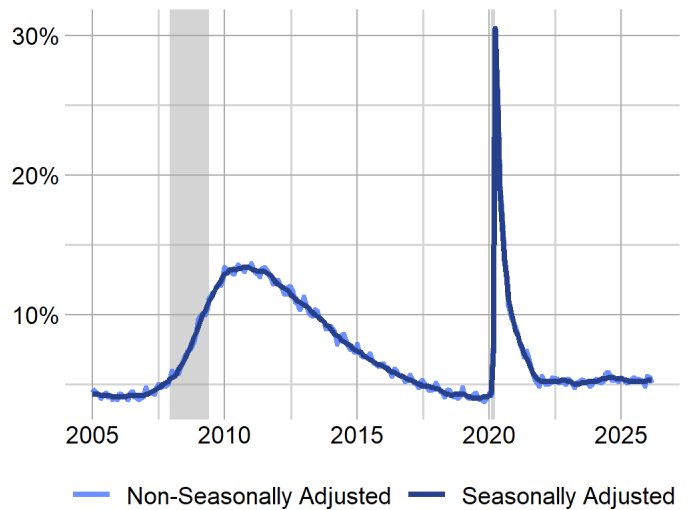
Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen seasonal employment patterns such as jobs associated with holiday hiring, holiday and weather seasons, or other jobs with seasonal components. The result of a seasonally adjusted estimate is usually a smoother estimate from which underlying economic trends can be seen. Adjusted estimates are in the summary table above, and in many of the other tables and figures throughout this document.

Nevada’s seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in March, which was unchanged from 5.3 percent in February, and was unchanged from 5.3 percent in March 2025. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 75 from February to a current level of 90,223 people, which increased by 2,044 unemployed people since March 2025. The labor force in Nevada is currently composed of 1,700,832 people, up from 2,804 people from February, and up 41,692 people since from 2025.

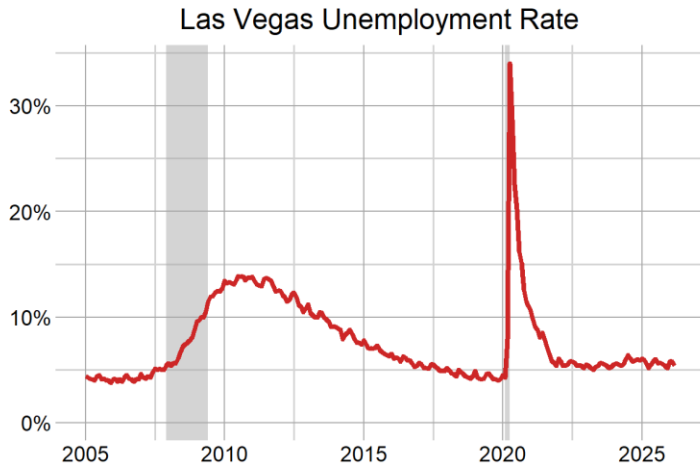
United States Unemployment Rate



Nevada Unemployment Rate

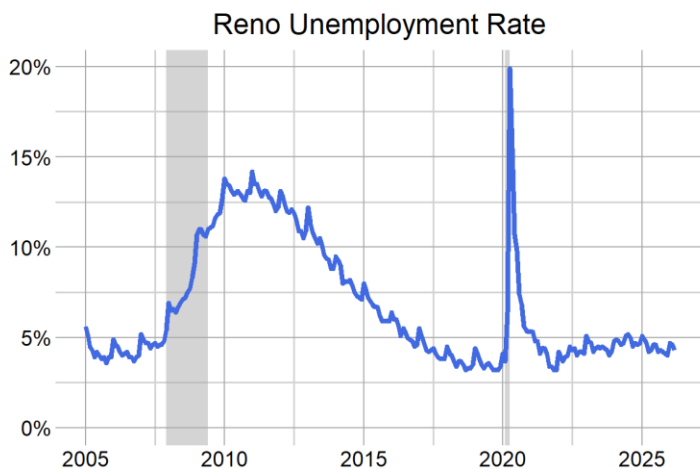


The Las Vegas Metropolitan Statistical Area’s (MSA) unemployment rate was 5.4 percent in March 2026, down from 5.8 percent in February, and down from 5.6 percent in March 2025, not seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 5,241 since February for a current level of 68,149 people, which is 1,841 fewer unemployed people than in March 2025. The labor force in Las Vegas is currently composed of 1,258,737 people, which is 610 more people than in February, and up 17,609 people since March 2025.



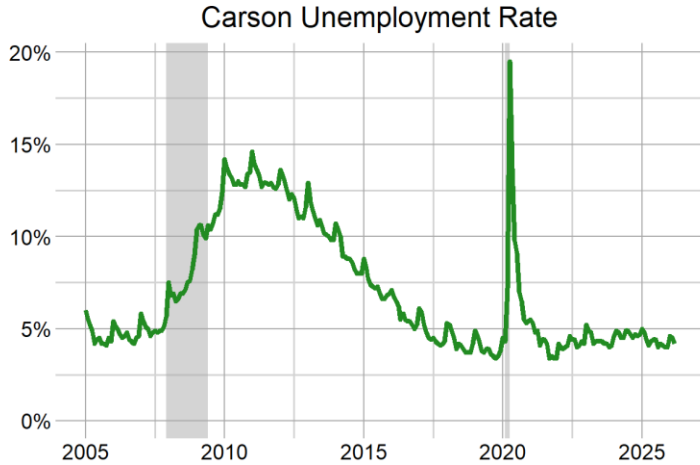

The Reno MSA’s unemployment rate was 4.3 percent in March 2026, down from 4.6 percent in February, and down from 4.7 percent in March 2025, non-seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 939 since February for a current level of 13,296 people, which is 1,034 fewer unemployed people than in March 2025. The labor force in Reno is currently composed of 310,581 people, which is 1,554 more people than in February, and up 3,144 people since March 2025.

The Carson City MSA’s unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in March, down from 4.5 percent in February, and down from 4.4 percent in March 2025, not seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 66 since February for a current level of 1,276 people, which is 63 fewer unemployed people than in March 2025. The labor force in Carson City is currently composed of 30,226 people, which is 202 more people than in February, and up 126 people since March 2025.

# Unemployment Insurance Benefits

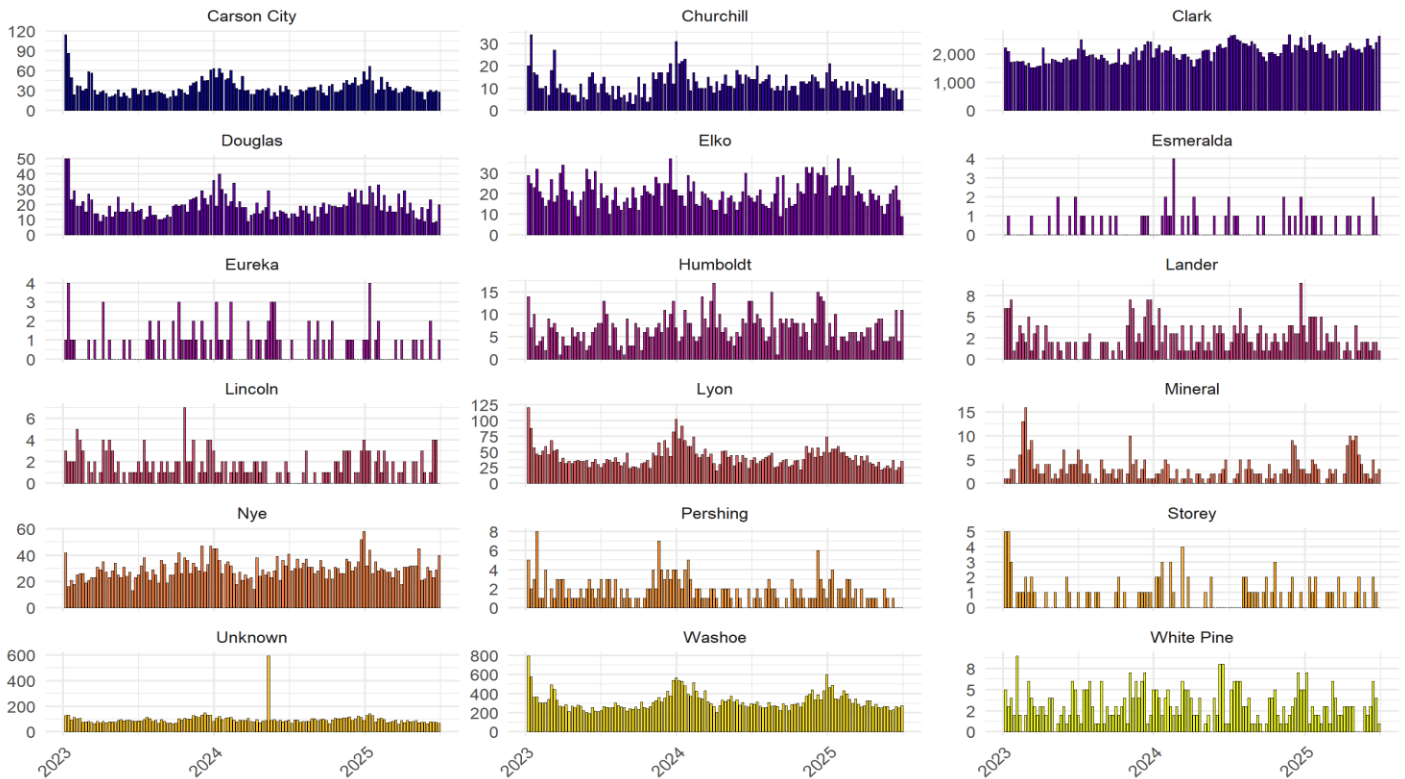
In March 2026, 10,779 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, representing an increase of 34 claims, or 0.3 percent, from February 2026 when there were 10,745 claims. However, this is an increase of 146 claims, or 1.4 percent, from March 2025 when there were 10,633 initial claims.

weekly claim totals since January 2023



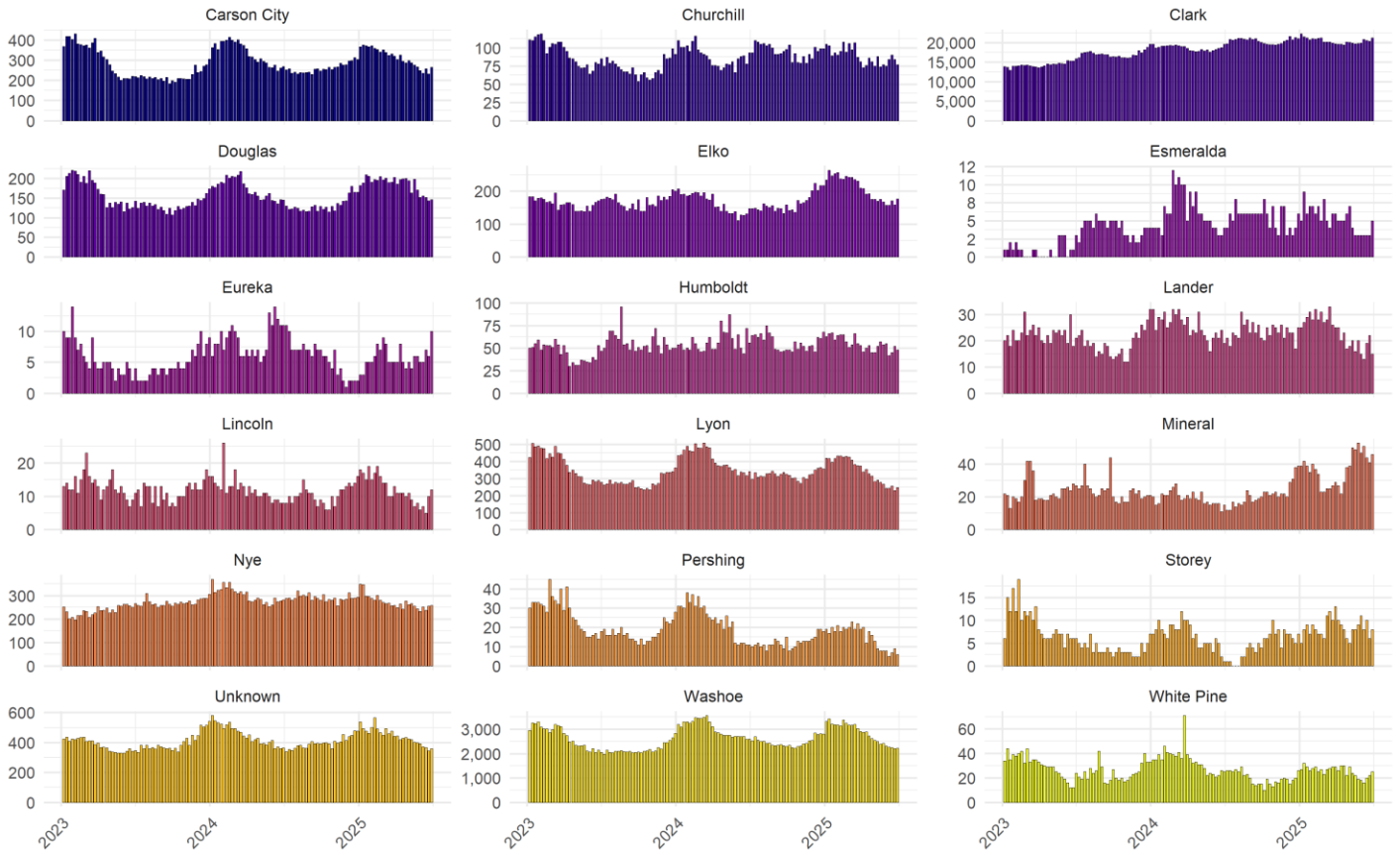
