DETR Releases Local Area Employment Statistics for May 2026

According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation's ([DETR](#)) May 2026 economic report, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.2 percent in May 2026, a decrease of 0.1 percentage points (pp) from April. Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen economic patterns, with the following estimates not seasonally adjusted.

In the three Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA), the unemployment rates were 5.3 percent in the Las Vegas area, 4.1 percent in Reno, and 4 percent in the Carson area in May 2026.

In Nevada's counties, the lowest unemployment rate was observed in Humboldt County at 3.5 percent, and Mineral County had the highest rate at 9.1 percent. For a look at the unemployment rate in your county, visit our [Area Profiles Page](#).

In May 2026, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada decreased by 0.1 percentage points (pp) compared to April 2026 and currently stands at 5.2 percent. Over the same period, the unadjusted unemployment rate increased by 0.2 pp, from 4.8 percent to 5 percent.

At the MSA (Metropolitan Statistical Area) level, Nevada experienced an increase in unemployment rates across all its MSAs compared to April 2026. In the Las Vegas-Henderson-North Las Vegas MSA, the unemployment rate increased by 0.2 pp, moving from 5.1 percent in April to 5.3 percent. The Reno-Sparks MSA unemployment rate increased by 0.2 pp, changing from 3.9 percent to 4.1 percent. Meanwhile, the Carson City MSA unemployment rate increased by 0.2 pp, moving from 3.8 percent in April to 4 percent. These figures are not seasonally adjusted.

At the county level, all of Nevada's 17 counties experienced an increase in unemployment rates compared to April 2026. The counties with the largest increases were Eureka (+0.9 pp), followed by Esmeralda (+0.7 pp).

Figures for state unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program, a state/federal partnership sponsored by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS-LAUS). This program produces monthly and annual employment, unemployment, and labor force data for census regions, states, counties, metropolitan areas, and many large cities, based on place of residence. 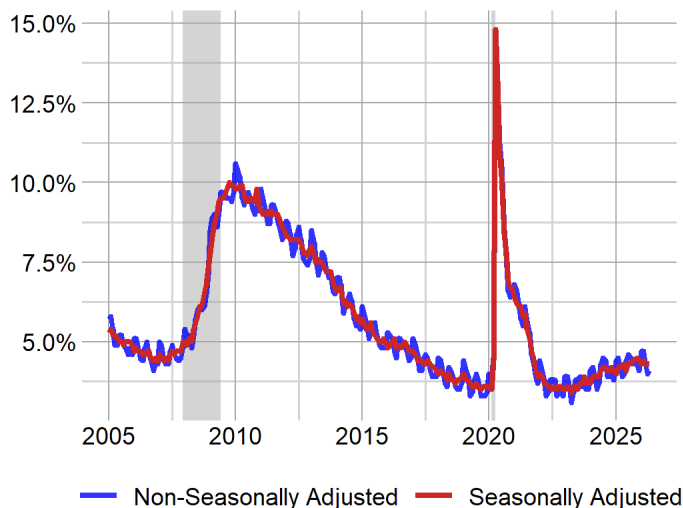

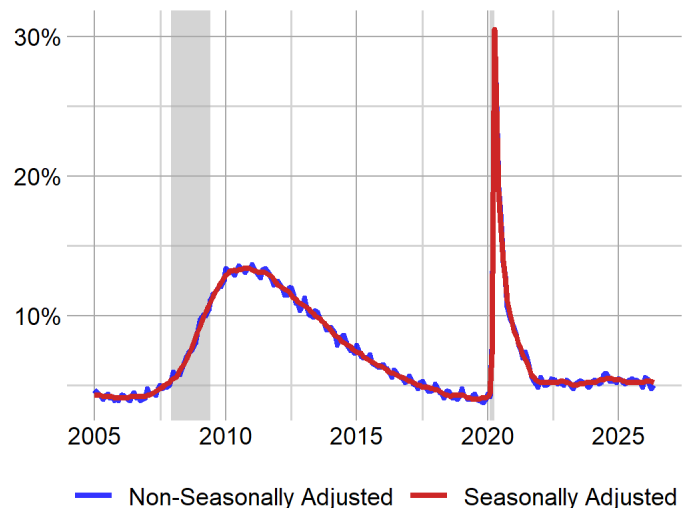
Seasonally adjusted estimates account for regularly seen seasonal employment patterns such as jobs associated with holiday hiring, holiday and weather seasons, or other jobs with seasonal components. The result of a seasonally adjusted estimate is usually a smoother estimate from which underlying economic trends can be seen. Adjusted estimates are in the summary table above, and in many of the other tables and figures throughout this document.

Nevada's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.2 percent in May, down 0.1 pp from 5.3 percent in April, and unchanged from 5.2 percent in May 2025. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 722 from April to a current level of 88,619 people, which increased by 1,549 unemployed people since May 2025. The labor force in Nevada is currently composed of 1,693,582 people, which has decreased by 3,780 people since April, and increased by 32,465 people since May 2025.

Nevada Unemployment Rate

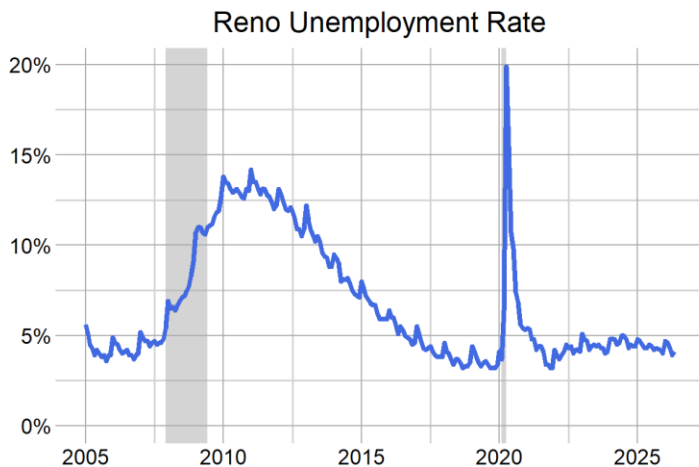


The Las Vegas Metropolitan Statistical Area’s (MSA) unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in May 2026, up 0.2 pp from 5.1 percent in April, and down 0.1 pp from 5.4 percent in May 2025, not seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 2,974 since April for a current level of 66,489 people, which is 334 fewer people than in May 2025. The labor force in Las Vegas is currently composed of 1,245,706 people, which is 6,231 more people than in April, and 16,719 more people than in May 2025.

The Reno MSA’s unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in May 2026, up 0.2 pp from 3.9 percent in April, and down 0.2 pp from 4.3 percent in May 2025, non-seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 734 since April for a current level of 12,606 people, which is 364 fewer unemployed people than in May 2025. The labor force in Reno is currently composed of 303,778 people, which is 485 more people than in April, and 2,207 more people than in May 2025.

The Carson City MSA’s unemployment rate was 4 percent in May, up 0.2 pp from 3.8 percent in April, and down 0.2 pp from 4.2 percent in May 2025, not seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 51 since April for a current level of 1,189 people, which is 67 fewer unemployed people than in May 2025. The labor force in Carson City is currently composed of 29,646 people, which is 5 more people than in April, and 248 fewer people than in May 2025.

Unemployment Insurance Benefits

In May 2026, 10,771 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, representing a decrease of 191 claims, or -1.7 percent, from April 2026 when there were 10,962 claims. However, this is a decrease of 598 claims, or -5.3 percent, from May 2025 when there were 11,369 initial claims.

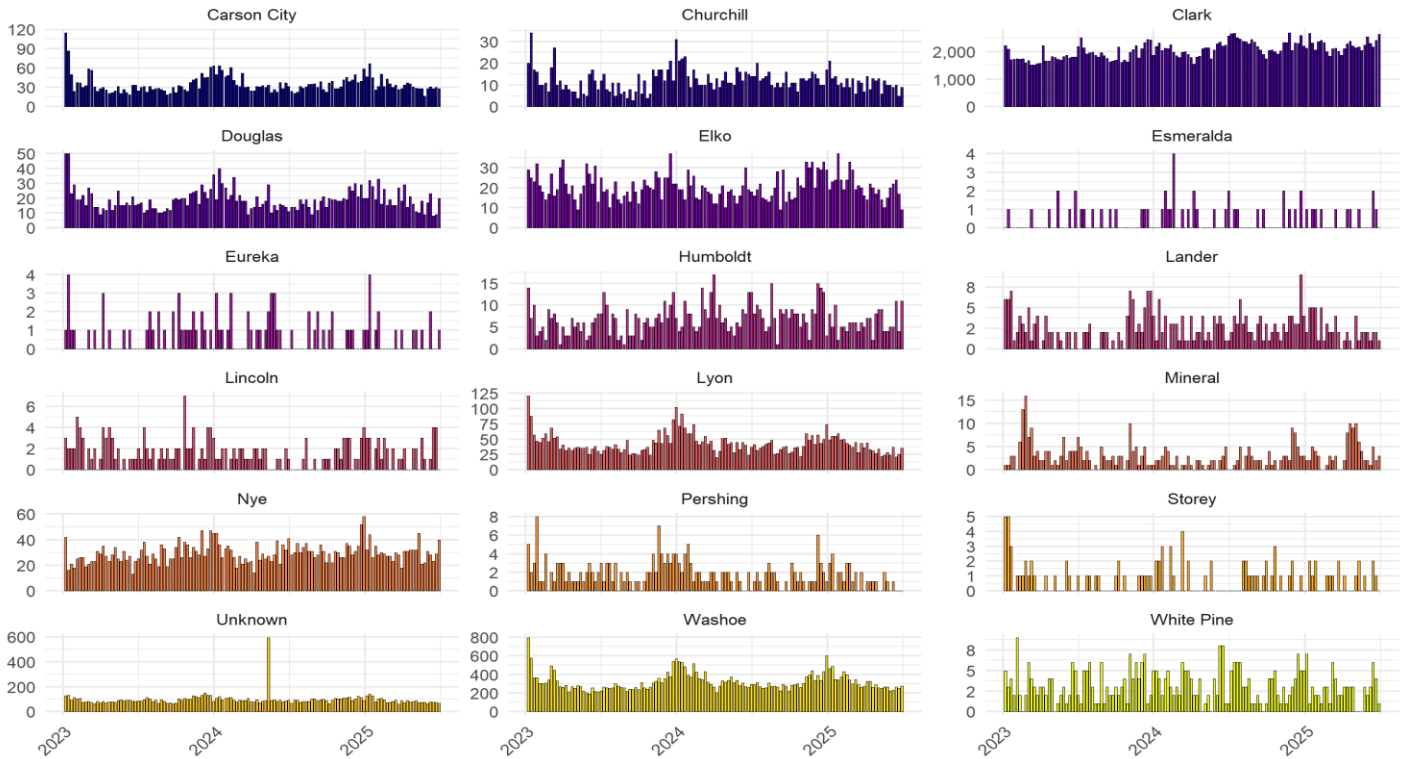

weekly claim totals since January 2023



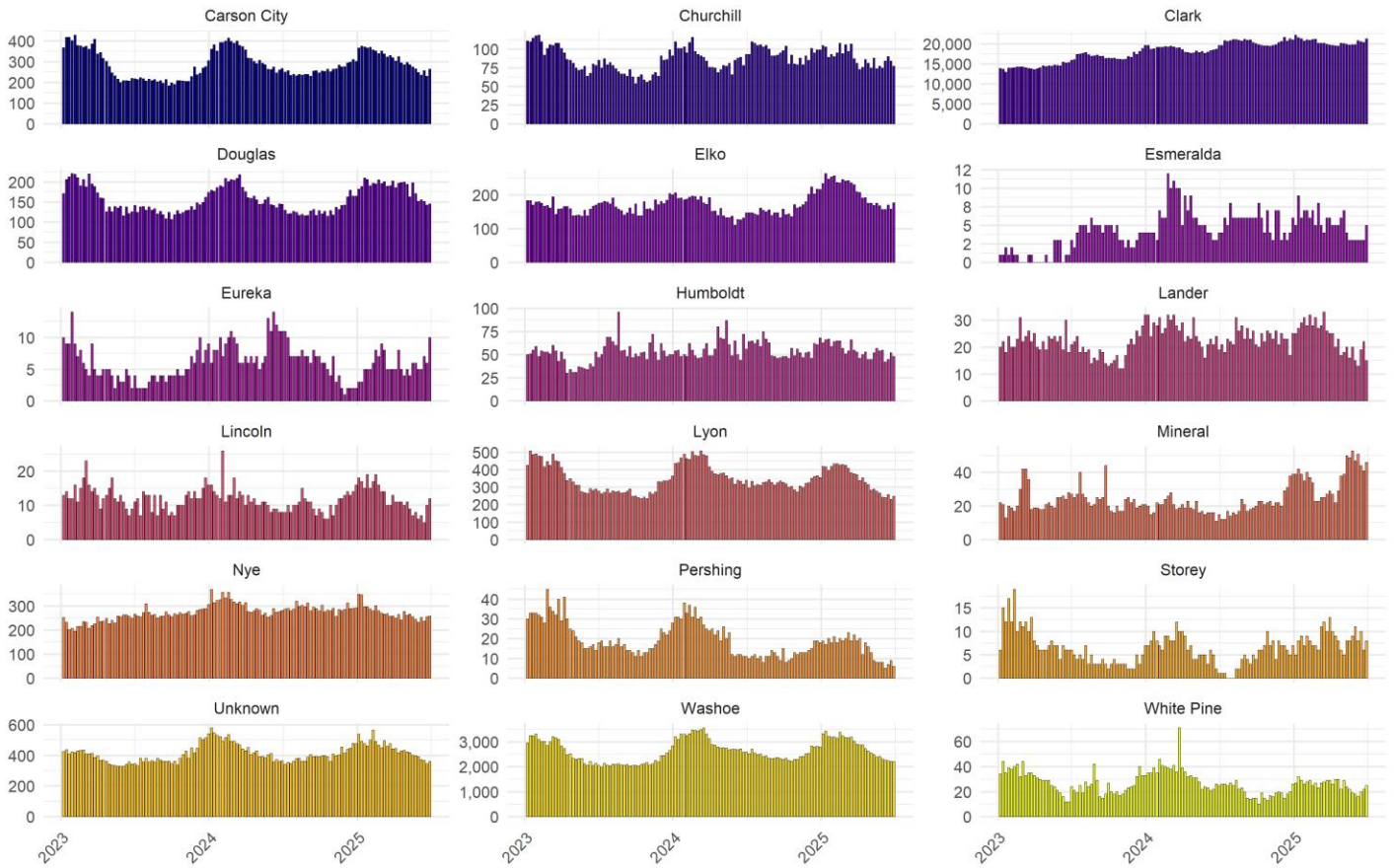
