Nevada Statewide & Metro Area Labor Market Overview

June 2024

Published on July 18, 2024

In June 2024, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada increased by 0.1 percentage points and now sits at 5.2 percent. The labor force grew by 1,606 over the month. This increase in labor force was the result of a decrease of 300 in employed individuals and an increase of 1,906 in unemployed individuals.

Nevada saw growth in its total number of jobs in June. The total non-farm employment in Nevada increased by about 2,300 jobs overall. These gains were largely due to the Leisure and Hospitality industry, which saw gains of 3,500 jobs. Some industries also saw decreases. Government, for example, saw a decrease of 1,500 jobs over the month and Professional and Business Services saw a decrease of 1,400.

The Las Vegas MSA saw a decrease equivalent to 2,000 jobs (or -0.2 percentage points) over the month. Meanwhile, the Reno MSA saw an increase of 600 jobs (or 0.2 percentage points). Finally, the Carson City MSA saw a decrease of 100 jobs (-0.3 percentage points)

Current Employment Statistics (CES)

Estimates for this section come from the Current Employment Statistics (CES) program sponsored by the Bureau of Labor statistics (<u>BLS</u>). Total nonfarm employment increased by 2,300 jobs from May to June, a growth rate of 0.1 percentage points. Las Vegas MSA total nonfarm employment realized a decrease of 2,000 jobs (-0.2 percentage points) from May to June. 


Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

Figures for our unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program sponsored by the (<u>BLS</u>). Nevada's unemployment rate was 5.2 percent in June, increased by 0.1 percentage points from 5.1 percent in May, and increased by 0.2 percentage points from 5 percent in June 2023, seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 1,906 from May to a current level of 84,676 people, which increased by 5,260 unemployed people since June 2023. The labor force in Nevada is currently 1,617,818 people, which increased by 1,606 people from May, and increased by 17,160 people since June 2023.




Unemployment Rate State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Nevada had the second highest state unemployment rate in the nation for the month of May 2024, at a figure of 5.1 percent. The only state with a higher unemployment rate was California, which sits at 5.2 percent.



Employment State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Nevada had the third highest over-the-year employment growth for the month of May 2024 at a figure of 3.3 percent. Ahead of Nevada are Alaska and South Carolina, both at 3.5 percent.




Over the Year Employment Growth Rank by State in May 2024

Unemployment Insurance


Turning to our monthly data, in June 2024, 11,663 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, an increase of 739 claims, or 6.8 percentage points, from May 2024 when there were 10,924 claims. This figure is an increase from the 9,732 figure that was observed in June of 2023.

Over-the-year claims activity for Nevada's regular program saw some decreases and some increases across its measures. Weeks claimed, for example, increased by 14,503 or 16.3 percentage points. Final payments (also known as benefit exhaustions) were also up, moving from 2,016 the previous month to 2,106 in June. Weeks compensated, however, were down by 0.4 percentage points over the month going from 79,325 to 79,036 for a decrease of 289.




The Trust Fund currently has a \$1.61 billion positive balance as of June 2024.






May 2024 - June 2024
